THREE AIRPORTS IN CHILE

Project Summary

The two airports of El Tepual (Puerto Montt) and La Florida (La Serena) were part of the first privatisation wave in Chile. The concessions included obligations for investments such as:

- A new terminal building (3,900m²), apron area (10,000m²), boarding bridges and car parking for 320 vehicles in Puerto Montt
- A new terminal building (2,200m²) and car parking for 130 vehicles in La Serena

The concession for the airport El Tepual in Puerto Montt was renewed in 2007 and again awarded to the consortia led by A-port Operaciones. The concession in La Florida was prolonged for 5 years in 2007.

In December 2011, the Cerro Moreno International Airport in Antofagasta, the second largest airport in Chile, was added to the portfolio.
